

NOTRE DAME UNION CHURCH CEMETERY BY PLOT NUMBER

LOT 1

JOSEPH LAWRENCE RILEY (1906-1906)

We have literally no information regarding this plot, other than the name listed on a Cemetery Plan and the words "Joseph Riley – child" written on a List of Burials in the Notre Dame Union Church Cemetery.

The Archives Death Records from 1888-1920 refer to a Joseph Lawrence Riley, Chatham. These records indicate the person to be a 3-day old child who died January 21, 1906, but was neither born nor died in Chatham, although recorded as belonging in Chatham. This could possibly mean that the parents considered Chatham to be their home.

The Union Church Records show a Joseph Riley on the church financial list for the year 1900. We can only assume this was his son, and we have no way of knowing when the family left the community or where they went.

The Riley name also appears in the last paragraph on page 2 of this History.

This child's name appears on the Memorial Stone erected in the Cemetery in October, 2003.

MRS. B. SMITH

We assume that this was Harriet Smith, wife of Bowen Smith. The Deed to the church and cemetery land was from them to the Church Trustees.

There appeared to be a pattern of keeping cemetery records based on the name of the person who requested/purchased the plot. It would be reasonable to assume that since the Smith's gave the land for the Notre Dame Union Church Cemetery that a plot would be set aside for them at that time. There is absolutely no indication of this plot having been actually used, and the Bowen Smith family disappeared from the community.

You will see from the early pages of this History regarding the community that Bowen and Harriet Smith owned the Mill in Notre Dame, which they ultimately sold to Charlie Lockhart. It turns out that Mr. Lockhart's first wife was the daughter of Bowen and Harriet. It is believed that the first Mrs. Lockhart died in childbirth, along with her first child; and we know that they are buried at St. Martin's in the Woods Anglican Cemetery in Shediac Cape with Charles Lockhart and his second wife. It is believed that Bowen and Harriet Smith are also buried at St. Martin's in the Woods Cemetery at Shediac Cape.

The Smith's owned the property beside the Notre Dame Union Church Cemetery, which later became the property of the Falconer's.

Lot 27 shows the name H. Smith (again probably the person requesting/purchasing this plot – Harrison Smith?). There is a tombstone that is seemingly misplaced on Lot 21, which we believe was intended for Lot 27. The stone indicates the person buried there to be Hattie Smith, who died March 11, 1901 aged 2 years, and daughter of Harrison and Annie Smith.

We have no way of knowing for certain, but Harrison Smith could have been a son of Harriet and Bowen Smith.

Two tombstones appear on Lot 21 - a small one for Hattie Smith, and a larger one showing the names Robert A. Robinson and his wife, Robina A. (Johnston), and their daughter, Annie B. Wilmarth.

If you look at the records for Lot 8 (James Johnston and Ann Chisholm) you will note that Robina Anne Johnston was their daughter, and married Robert Ansley Robinson. Another daughter of James and Ann was Mary Katherine Johnston, who married Fred Smith.

If Fred Smith happened also to be a son of Harriet and Bowen Smith and brother of Harrison Smith (father of Hattie Smith) this could possibly provide a connection explaining why Hattie Smith's tombstone ended up on the same plot with Robina A. Johnston and her family.

Henry Adams West was the son of George West and Mary Matthews, and he had a brother, Robert, and a sister, Matilda.

Henry West was born August 18, 1840 in P.E.I. and died January 19, 1920. His wife, Janet McBean, was born August 12, 1832 in Inverness, Scotland, and died February 24, 1924.

Children of Henry A. West and Janet McBean:

David - born December 2, 1863; died 1949.

Alena Christina – born August 10, 1865 at Dundas; died March 25, 1956 – buried at Gladeside. She married William Falconer. Her children were: Ruth, Ethel, Kenneth H., Earl R., Percy W., Cecil H., Allister L. and W. Wallace.

Harold Robert - born January 15, 1867; died in 1950's in Boston.

Annie Matilda – born May 4, 1868; died in 1942.

Jessie Margaret – born October 16, 1871; died June 22, 1965. Jessie is buried in this lot with her parents – she married Mr. Wemp and had three children – Janette (Steadman), Marjorie and Kathleen (Mills). After his death she married F.B. Seeley on July 9, 1919. There were no further children.

Henry Adams West's direct ancestor was Francis West, also known as "Francis of Duxbury" (1606-1692) from Duxbury, Mass. Francis West has been recorded as being the son of Capt. Francis West (1586-1634), who along with his brothers – one being Thomas West, 2nd Baron de la Warr, settled the Virginia Colonies and surrounding territory. Then there is the other side where some say "Francis of Duxbury" was just a poor man from England. (Source: "West Lines" by Margaret Ells)

The de la Warr's are among Britain's oldest families ... who entered a bay on the American east coast in 1610 and gave the family name to the surrounding land – "Delaware", one of the original 13 states. The 10th Earl de la Warr owned England's 6,400-acre Ashdown Forest, which author, A.A. Milne, made famous as the imaginary playground for Winnie the Pooh and Friends. Leonard Couch was born March 14, 1922. He and his first wife, Mary VanBuskirk, had three children:

Brenda – born April 23, 1947, married Robert Palmer and currently lives in

Middleton, Wisconsin. They have a son, Adam Piers, born April 21,1977.

Stephen – born June 16, 1950, married Gisele Gallant, and they have a son, Jason

Joseph, born September 4, 1980. Stephen died October 12, 2003.

Kimberley - born February 3, 1962, married Larry LeBlanc, and currently lives in PEI.

Leonard's second wife is Doris (Gauvin), born November 7, 1937, who presently lives in Moncton.

Leonard's parents were Robert <u>Herbert</u> Johnston and Marjorie Chapman. His father was born April 29, 1899, died October 27, 1973, and was the son of James M. Johnston and Sarah Dysart (Lot 37 this Cemetery). His mother was born January 9, 1904 and died September 2, 1986. Herbert and Marjorie Johnston are buried in Elmwood Cemetery.

ROBERT JAMES JOHNSTON (1894-1894) EMILY HAZEL JOHNSTON (1898-1898)

Children of George and Margaret Johnston (Lot 9)

Names of these children are shown on the Tombstone on Lot 9.

Robert James was born February 27, 1894 and died December 12, 1894.

JAMES JOHNSTON	(1831-1913)

MARY KATHERINE (JOHN	ISTON) SMITH (1863-1921)

James Johnston was born in Notre Dame August 9, 1831, and died October 19, 1913. His wife, Ann, was born May 14, 1837 in Salmon River, N.B. Ann died in 1930. James and Ann were married November 28, 1854.

Their daughter, Mary <u>Katherine</u> Smith, was born February 2, 1863 and died in 1921. She married Fred Smith July 20, 1886. They had a son, William, who married Neta and lived in the United States. In my source it appears that Frederick Smith died February 22, 1926. The names on this plot's tombstone are James and Ann, however, based on burial records it appears that Katherine was brought home at her death to be buried with her parents. Her name has been shown on the Memorial Stone erected in the Cemetery in October 2003.

James and Ann had thirteen children (listed below):

Emily Jane – born September 29, 1855, married James Cobham and is buried in Lot 28.

Robina Anne – born December 16, 1857 - married Robert Ansley Robinson – buried Lot 21.

George Andrew - born February 25, 1860 - died December 25, 1922. He married Gladys November 13, 1883 and lived in Lynn, Massachusetts. They had no family. John Thomas - born February 8, 1862, died March 16, 1862.

Mary Katherine - born February 2, 1863 - died 1921 - buried in this plot with parents.

James McKie – born June 12, 1865 and died June 9, 1950 – buried in Lot 37.

<u>John Thomas</u> – born October 2, 1867 – died January 2, 1930. He married Tina MacAskill.

Robert Howard – born September 13, 1869 and died May 10, 1963 – he married Mary Balser. Robert Howard was the father of Elizabeth (Johnston) Crawford, known as Bessie, who married Ellsworth Crawford. Bessie and Ellsworth Crawford are buried in Elmwood Cemetery, however, their daughter, Ruby, is buried in Lot 48 this Cemetery.

See information on page 20 regarding Bob and Mary Johnston and their family. Bertha Mary – born October 12, 1871 – died March 2, 1946 – she married John Horsman.

Their three children (or three of their children) are buried in Lot 20.

Ida Maud - born July 4, 1873- married Purdy Blair.

<u>Herbert Bannister</u> – born April 27, 1875 – married – had one son, Herbert, and lived in St. Louis, Mo.

Child (no name) – born June 9, 1877 and died June 9, 1877.

Hartley Henderson – born June 22, 1878 – married Eva September 30, 1908 – lived in Youngstown, Ohio – no children.

GEORGE A. JOHNSTON 1862-1934)
MARGARET DYSART (1875-1954)
GEORGE STANLEY JOHNSTON (1908-1920)

George Albert Johnston was born in 1862 and died February 13, 1934. He is believed to have been adopted by Alexander Hugh and Bertha Johnston (son of William Johnston – Lot 34) according to genealogical records. This is a little confusing considering that the age differentiation between Alexander and George was only five years. In any event, the church burial records indicate that a "Robert McIntyre" was buried in this plot with George, Margaret and Stanley. These records indicate that Mr. McIntyre died February 19, 1912 and was buried February 21, 1912 at the Union Church Burial Grounds, and that he was 88 years of age. This record was signed by Pastor J.B. Young. Some of the older people in the community believed that Robert McIntyre was George's biological father.

Based on the burial records Robert McIntyre's name was added to the Memorial Stone erected in October 2003.

George married Margaret Rebecca (Maggie) Dysart November 13, 1893 (George would have been 31 years of age at the time of his marriage, so he could well have been living in the United States with Alexander and Bertha Johnston and returned to Notre Dame where he met Maggie). Maggie was born in 1875 and died May 3, 1954.

Maggie's sister, Sarah (married to James Johnston) is buried in Lot 37, and another sister, Cassie (married to Elisha Crawford) is buried in Lot 16.

George and Maggie had nine children (listed below):

Cassie D. – born October 1893 and died May 3, 1953. She married Abraham McConnell (July 12, 1888 – January 9, 1965). They are buried in Elmwood Cemetery. They had eight children:

Norval Earl - born January 17,1918, died May 1997 - married Alcha Delia Keith July 6, 1957 they had two children — Norval Keith born May 3, 1958 married Nancy Tingley in 1990 and has a son, Kyle born May 1994; and Katherine Elizabeth born June 7,1960 married Timothy Paunins July 13, 1985). Norval was a locomotive engineer, and he was the engineer on the first "diesel" passenger train out of Halifax on September 17, 1955. This just happened to be the day that Lois and Ralph MacDonald were married, and when they and some of their guests arrived at the train station in Moncton, Norval noticed them and had some fun tooting the train whistle until the couple got on their train taking them to Montreal, Toronto and Niagara Falls for their honeymoon. Norval also drove the Buctouche train by times and always tooted when he was going by his Grandmother's house in Notre Dame. He'd toot the train whistle and she would wave her cup-towel.

Gladys Muriel - born 1919, died June 5, 1926 - buried in Notre Dame Union Church Cemetery in Lot 10 - shown on Memorial Stone erected October 2003 and also shown on parents' tombstone in Elmwood Cemetery.

Allison Percy - born April 8, 1921, died September 17, 1997 - married Corinne Haystead in 1951 - they resided in Aurora, Ontario and had four children: (Janice Margaret born January 11, 1952 married Richard Gordon Matthew in 1978 - they have one child, Taylor Alexander, born March 10, 1980); (Joanne Vivian born February 27, 1953); (Grant Allison, born April 22, 1958 married Noella Joy Thompson in 1988); and (Bruce Charles, born October 6, 1961);

Elmer Lloyd -born October 15, 1922 – married Marion Beatrice Moresleod April 22, 1948 – they have no family. Elmer died on March 16, 1995, and is buried in Elmwood Cemetery, Moncton. Marion is re-married now to Sterling Smith.

Hinson - 1926-1926- buried Elmwood Cemetery.

Eldon Ray - born in 1928 and died February 20, 1930 - buried in Elmwood Cemetery.

Margaret -born October 31, 1913 and married Frank Tingley – they have lived in Edmonton, Alberta for years and had two sons – (Kenneth and Collin). Frank died September 6, 1990. Collin and his wife, Debbie, live with Margaret and help care for her now.)

Robert Blair - born April 6, 1915 – Blair married Margaret Battis of Moncton on September 10, 1940. They had one son, *Scott*, born April 14, 1952, who has two daughters, - *Heather* born October 10, 1976 and *Karen*, born April 12, 1979. Scott lives in Halifax at the present time. Blair died April 8, 1999, and his wife, Margaret, lives at Parkland Estates (Royal Court), Riverview. Blair is buried in Elmwood Cemetery, Moncton. Blair was also a locomotive engineer like his older brother, Norval, and he also made some trips through Notre Dame on the Buctouche train run.

Robert James - born February 27, 1894, died December 12, 1894 - buried Lot 7.

Norval James - born 1895, died August 25, 1976 - unmarried - buried in Lot 10.

Emily Hazel - (1898-1898) - buried in Lot 7 with Robert James.

<u>John Harvey</u> – was born September 24, 1900 and died August 29, 1983. He married Eva Catherine Teed, who was Leslie Teed's sister (Lila's husband), and they had three children – <u>Ralph Harvey</u> (born September 16, 1931, married Joan Marie Woodworth, born 1939, on September 10, 1960, lives in Bedford, N.S. now that he is retired from the R.C.M.P., and has two children: *Jennifer Catherine* born May 29, 1962 married Paul O'Connor, and they have two daughters – *Jillian Marie* born May 5, 1995 and *Catherine Elaine* born February 21, 1997 - they live in Halifax, N.S.; and *John David* born June 25, 1964 married Christine, and they also have two daughters, *Chelsea*

Dawn, born July 15, 1994 and Caileigh Jane, born May 12, 1997 - they live in Bedford, N.S.); Lois Ann (born September 28, 1934, married Arthur Ralph MacDonald, born 1934, September 17, 1955 - they live in Moncton, N.B., and have four children: John Brian born January 21, 1957; Delma Ann born October 24, 1958 who married Michael Alexander September 28, 1991 and has one child, Brendan Ian born June 23, 1994; Rodney Ralph born July 20 1962 who married Susan Lockhart June 14, 1986 and has two children Ryan James born October 12, 1990 in Mississauga, Ont., and Gretchen Margaret born September 22, 1993 in Mount Gambier, Australia. Rod was working for McCain Foods, and the family moved back to Canada in December 1995 and lives in Florenceville, N.B.; and James Johnston born July 9, 1967 who married Marci Squires May 19, 2001 - they live in Toronto); and Delma Jean (born June 2, 1937- graduated from the Moncton Hospital School of Nursing in the Class of '58. After she wrote and passed her Registered Nurse's exams she and some of her classmates went by train to Welland, Ontario, and later on to Hamilton. She worked at the Nora Frances Henderson Hospital in Hamilton for 32 years. Following her retirement in 1992 she moved back to Moncton where she has her own apartment).

Eva was born February 1902 and died October 2, 1939. John married Elizabeth Jean MacDiarmid in 1940 – they had no family.

<u>Lila</u> – born March 2, 1903 – died September 3, 1935. She married Leslie Teed, and had a daughter, <u>Margaret Agnes</u>, born May 5, 1935 - Margaret never married.

Myrtle Jeanette – born August 20, 1905 and died August 31, 1954. Myrtle married Claude H. Cotter (1904-1963) – they had no children. Myrtle cared for Lila's daughter, Margaret Agnes, after her mother's death until Margaret's father, Leslie Teed, eventually married Margaret Reardon in 1940. Myrtle is buried in Elmwood Cemetery, and Claude is buried in the Catholic Cemetery on the Shediac Road.

<u>Stanley</u> – born in 1908 – died in 1920 at the age of 12 from a ruptured appendix. He was buried in this plot with his parents.

Violet Mae – born October 13, 1910 and died September 22, 1995. Violet married Ralph McLeod June 18, 1939, and had two sons: Douglas Ralph (born February 1, 1943, married Faye Sellick on May 29, 1965 and they had two sons: Gary Douglas, born October 22, 1965, unmarried, and Greg Donald born November 1, 1967, who married France Gravelle September 10, 1994 and has two children – Justin Greg, born on Grammie Violet's birthday, October 13, 1995 and Amanda Lyne, born May 15, 1998 – they all live in the Ottawa area (Orleans) where Douglas is retired from the R.C.M.P.); and John David Charles (born May 5, 1951- David married Brenda Williams on August 4, 1984 and they have two sons – Scott and Jeffrey. They live in Sussex, New Brunswick.

NORVAL J. JOHNSTON (1895-1976)

Norval James Johnston was born in 1895 – son of George and Margaret (Maggie) Johnston, who are buried in Lot 9, and brother to Robert James and Emily Hazel, buried in Lot 7.

Norval was a longtime resident of Notre Dame (the exception being in the years nearing the end of his life when he lived with his sister, Violet, and her husband, Ralph McLeod, for a time and also for a time at the Jordan Memorial Home). He died August 25, 1976. He had never married, and remained in the family home all the years he lived in Notre Dame.

Dorothy Johnston has a photograph of Norval and Ellsworth Crawford dressed in military uniforms and looking very young, so I believe it is safe to say that Norval served in the First World War.

One of the many memories family and neighbours have about Norval was that he owned a Model T Ford. This automobile, however, was demolished in an accident which occurred as he and his Mother were leaving Arthur and Mirinda Johnston's home after a visit there. A car came very fast up the hill and struck Norval's car. It was quite a mishap and luckily nobody was killed. Then Norval bought a Model A Ford. He was always great at taking people to vote, or to the Catholic Church to have their new babies christened! He was always a cheerful giver and helped many families in the area by giving them milk or potatoes and vegetables from his garden.

Gladys Muriel McConnell – daughter of Norval's sister, Cassie, and her husband, Abraham McConnell, is buried in this plot. Her name is shown on her parents' tombstone in Elmwood Cemetery, and has also been recorded on the Memorial Stone erected in this Cemetery in October 2003.

Gladys Muriel was born in 1919 and died June 5, 1926. Her mother was born October 1893 and died May 3, 1953, and her father was born July 12, 1888 and died January 9, 1965. They are buried in Elmwood Cemetery.

GEORGE COLBORNE (1891-1891) CURTIS COLBORNE (1899-1971)

The N.B. Archives Death Records (1888-1920) indicates that George Colburn (presumably incorrectly spelled) was born and died in Notre Dame, and was 3 days old on the date of his death - July 1, 1891.

We have no further information about him.

Curtis Colborne was born July 8, 1899 and died in 1971. He was the son of William J. (Billy) Colborne (1856-1934) and Mora Lee (Wood) Colborne (1872-1917). His parents, grandmother and a brother are buried in Lot 18. Descendants who attended his burial were surprised that he was not buried in the same plot with the other members of his family, but decided that the reason for this was that Lot 18 was over-crowded. One would assume that George (above) was related in some way to Curtis, but we have no information to be sure of that.

Both the above names have been recorded on the Memorial Stone erected in the Cemetery in October 2003.

WILLIAM McWILLIAMS (1845-1911)

The tombstone on this plot records only the above name, although church burial records indicate that three persons are buried here (no names given).

William McWilliams was one of the Trustees recorded in a Deed from Bowen Smith (mill owner) and his wife, Harriet Smith, to the Trustees of the Protestant Burying Ground in connection with the Union Church, so called. This document was dated 1894. It would, therefore, appear that Mr. McWilliams was a respected member of the community and the Union Church. The earliest pew rental list we have begins in 1899, and Williams McWilliams does not appear on it. This would presumably mean that Mr. McWilliams left the community between 1894 and 1899.

You will remember that the second resident of Notre Dame was Alex McWilliams, who was originally from Scotland and was granted his land about 1825. We now have information that Alexander McWilliams is shown on the 1861 census as the father of William McWilliams - census records say that Alexander was 43 years of age in 1861. That would mean that Alexander was born in 1818, which doesn't work very well with the information regarding his land grant having been given to him "about 1825", however, the word "about" could account for the difference.

The 1861 census information states that Alexander McWilliam was Presbyterian and a farmer. His wife, Catherine was 49 (therefore born 1812), and their children were: Lettia, daughter, age 18, farm labourer; Alexander, son, age 17, farm labourer; William, son, age 16, farm labourer; Archibald, son, age 13, farm labourer; and Sarah J., daughter, age 8.

Kent County Death Records (PANB Film # 16254 C1F1 pg. 31) show that Catherine McWilliams who lived in Notre Dame died February 1890 at Cocagne. Her religious affiliation was Episcopal, but we cannot read either the age or the cause of death. The census records indicated Catherine to have been born in 1812, so if the Death Record that was located for Catherine McWilliams is indeed Alexander's wife she would have died at the age of 78. Since we do not know when Alexander died, we have no way of determining if he died much earlier than Catherine, and could have been buried elsewhere than this Cemetery (this Cemetery came into existence between 1889 and 1891).

Kent County Death Records (PANB Film #16254 C1F1 pg. 31) also show an Archibald McWilliams who lived and died in Notre Dame. The date of his death is August 20, 1891 at the age of 39, and he died of typhoid fever. The census records show that Archibald was 13 years old in 1861, making his birth year to be 1848. The Death Record date of 1891 at age 39 does not work out exactly with Archibald's supposed birth date of 1848 (which would have made him 39 in 1887, not 1891).

It is possible that the three people buried here are William, his mother Catherine, and his brother, Archibald. This remains a mystery.

JACOB CRAWFORD (1840-1908) WILLIAM JOHN CRAWFORD (1871 -)

Jacob Crawford -

The N.B. Archives Death Records (1888-1920) indicates that Jacob Crawford, aged 68, residence Notre Dame, born Pugwash, N.S., died at Notre Dame March 17, 1908. He was a blacksmith and his religious affiliation was Episcopal.

The Crawford genealogy records indicate that Jacob was the son of Daniel Crawford and Mary A. Crawford. William H. Crawford (Lot 46) was also the son of Daniel and Mary Crawford. Daniel died in 1861 and is buried in Cocagne (corner of South Cocagne Road).

Josiah Crawford (who may have been Daniel Crawford's father - unable to confirm) is reported to have been the first inhabitant of Hayes Village, which was an area on the north side of the Cocagne River just down river from Alexandrina (what is now the North Cocagne Road), and his property is shown on an old map as being next-door to Robert Johnston's home. The land was granted in 1853. At that time the property consisted of 50 acres which ran to the river.

Genealogy records accumulated by the "Gray" family show that Joachomish Crawford, presumed to be Jacob (nicknamed Jake), married Henrietta Ann Gray (born 1849) on November 9, 1868. A story that was circulated in the community of Notre Dame, was that immediately following the wedding ceremony, which was supposed to have taken place in the Union Church (the Union Church didn't exist in 1868), the bride and groom left the church and a short distance down the road a disagreement occurred and the bride ended the marriage and one of them left the wagon. Supposedly the marriage remained dissolved. One story even suggests that as the couple left the church for home that Jake spoke of the fact that Henrietta could now sign her property over to him, whereupon Henrietta became angry and told him "Never". This begs the question "how would a 19 year old woman in 1868 have acquired property in the first place?"

Another tale that has emerged is that Henrietta's first marriage to Jake Crawford left her with some property when he died (Henrietta would have been 59 when Jake died if our dates are correct). Henrietta, who was referred to in the community as "Rettie Jake", then later married William Budd. According to this version of the story it was Mr. Budd who suggested that her property be signed over to him on their wedding day, and that the second marriage was the one that ended so abruptly.

The second story seems more likely to be the accurate one.

Mae (Crawford) Doige remembers "Rettie Jake" and that she lived in a little house on the South Cocagne Road near what is now called the "Teed Road", where the Teed's and Crawford's lived. Mae remembers that her mother sat with Rettie when she was dying.

WILLIAM JOHN CRAWFORD -

William John Crawford was born in 1871, the son of William H. Crawford and Mary A. (Abegail) Marr (Lot 46).

The Crawford family records indicate that Jake and John lived next door to each other. Church burial records show 2 persons buried in this plot shown as belonging to J. Crawford. Both men appear on a list of persons buried in this Cemetery, and both names appear on the Memorial Stone erected in October 2003.

THOMAS GAMBLE (1815-1903)

Thomas Gamble was born in P.E.I. in 1815 and died in New Brunswick January 29, 1903. He died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. James Tidd, and a Moncton newspaper dated February 4, 1903 reported that he was buried at "Union Churchyard in Notre Dame". His parents were: Thomas Gamble, born ca 1784, died after 1841, P.E.I., and Ann, born ca 1788, P.E.I., died between 1826 and 1829, P.E.I. They married ca 1808. Thomas' name appears on the Memorial Stone erected in this Cemetery October 2003. Thomas married Catharine Quigley before 1845 in P.E.I. Catharine was born in P.E.I. in 1819, and died December 20, 1893. She is buried in the Notre Dame Catholic Church Cemetery. Thomas and Catharine came to N.B. 1851-1854. They had ten children: Daniel Gamble - born 1845, Seven Mile Bay Parish, Prince Co., P.E.I. Joshua Gamble - (called George) was born January 1, 1848, St. Mary's Parish, P.E.I. He died August 1, 1891 in Notre Dame, N.B., and was buried at St. Alban's Anglican Cemetery, Cocagne. He married Margaret McDonald on October 12, 1882, St. John's United Church, Moncton, N.B. Joshua was a millwright, and died of consumption. Margaret was born in 1850, died April 26, 1890 and is buried in the Roman Catholic Cemetery, Notre Dame. They had two children: John Gamble, born October 4, 1883, and Ellen Catherine Gamble who was born June 16, 1887 and died August 10, 1888. William Gamble - born March 4, 1849 at St. Mary's Parish, Prince Co., P.E.I. Amos Gamble - born 1850 in P.E.I. and died October 6, 1928 at the home of his sister, Mrs. James Tidd (Adelaide), in Irishtown, N.B. He never married and is buried in the Notre Dame Catholic Church Cemetery. He joined the Catholic Church three weeks prior to his death.

Mary Jane Gamble – born February 15, 1851, St. Mary's Parish, P.E.I., buried October 18, 1876 at St. Alban's Anglican Cemetery, Cocagne, New Brunswick.

John Gamble – born about 1853, Westmorland County, N.B. He married Jessie Wood, and they had a son, John William, who was born in 1887 at Kouchibouguac, N.B. and died in 1952. Jessie died shortly after her son was born. Her sister, Annie (Wood) McIsaac, raised him as her own son. Annie already had a son named John, so it appears that John William Gamble became known as William John McIsaac.

Martha Gamble – born September 29, 1854 in Westmorland County, N.B., christened October 20, 1857 at St. Martins-in-the-Woods Anglican Church, Shediac Cape, Westmorland County, N.B. It was a private baptism (mother Catholic).

Adelaide Gamble – born August 20, 1857, Westmorland County, N.B. and christened October 20, 1857 at St. Martins-in-the-Woods Anglican Church Shediac Cape, N.B. Adelaide married James William Tidd on October 6, 1879 at Cocagne, Kent County, N.B. She died March 1, 1942 at Tankville, Westmorland County, N.B. and was buried March 4, 1942 in the Roman Catholic Cemetery, Notre Dame, N.B.

Margaret Gamble – born April 5, 1861, Westmorland County, N.B. She married Harris Harding Mullin and lived in Somerville, Massachusetts. Margaret died September 17, 1940 while visiting relatives in New Brunswick, and was buried in Lot 44 this Cemetery. Gazilda Gamble – born in 1871 at Kent County, N.B. She married John Hernan on June 19, 1893 in Boston, Mass. and died April 13, 1930 in Phoenix, Arizona - buried at St. Francis Cemetery, Phoenix, Arizona.

Thomas Teed was born June 2, 1838, and died in 1907. He met and married Alice Donnelly in Saint John, N.B., and most of their children were born while they were living in Saint John, with the exception of Edna, William and Samuel who were born either at Shediac River or Notre Dame. Thomas and Alice returned to live on what is believed to have been Thomas' father's property at Shediac River for some years before moving to Notre Dame sometime between 1881 and 1891.

Alice was born August 7, 1848 and died October 19, 1928.

Their children were:

Arthur – born May 8, 1873, died December 18, 1949 – not married – buried Lot 45.

Albert Joseph was born in Saint John January 23, 1874 and died April 16, 1949. He married Ada Teed in 1899. Ada was born October 16, 1877 and died February 17, 1958. Albert converted to Catholicism (Ada was Catholic), and they are buried together in Pleasant Street Catholic Cemetery, Moncton.

Albert and Ada had 10 children:

Alice born January 13, 1900 - died June 15, 1972 - had 1 child Elsie born April 23, 1901 - died February 27, 1972

Russell James, born January 16, 1903 (married Yvonne Girouard) - died April 11, 1984. They had 5 children: Teresa Ann Marie, Patrick Russell, Joseph Norman, Cecelia Mary and Mary Ann.

Ella born September 22, 1904 - died March 12, 1999

Willis born October 10, 1906 - died 1990 - had 10 children

Albert born November 30, 1908 - died 1993 - had 14 children, one of whom is Wayne Teed who lives in Moncton.

Dorothy born October 14, 1911 - died October 6, 1989

Eva born in 1913 - died October 17, 2000

Rhoda born June 24, 1916 - died May 8, 1996 - had 2 children

Ernest (Roy) born December 6, 1919 - died March 1, 2000 - had 6 children

John T. (Jack) - born May 27, 1876, died Feb. 7, 1953 - not married - buried Lot 45.

<u>Charles Everett</u> was born in Saint John December 6, 1877 and died in December, 1956 in Saint John. He is buried in Ocean View Memorial Gardens Cemetery in Saint John. He married Katherine Willis July 22, 1916 in Saint John. Their children were:

- Jean who married Fred Green, or another source suggests Fred Willis.
- George Harry who married Dorothy Linton. George died in 1999.

George M. - born September 9, 1879, died Feb. 1955 - not married - buried Lot 45.

Edna A. – born July 11, 1883, died of leukemia September 23, 1945 – not married. She is remembered for taking care of her parents, unmarried brothers, her brother William and her nephew, Atkin. She is remembered as a kind caring lady who was a wonderful cook and housekeeper.

William J. – born March 11, 1886, married Emma B. Cobham October 15, 1906, died March 22, 1908.

Samuel Wesley – born at either Shediac River or Notre Dame April 24, 1888. He married Annie Stuart in Moncton, N.B, October 27, 1920. Annie was born in 1892. - buried Lot 43.

WILLIAM J. TEED

was born March 11, 1886, Notre Dame, N.B. and died at Notre Dame March 22, 1908 at the age of 22 of consumption. He married Emma B. Cobham October 15, 1906, Westmorland County, N.B. She was born March 17, 1889, Saint John, N.B. to George and Annie ----- (not legible) (source: 1906 Marriage Record of Emma & William), witness James Cobham. Emma lived with William James Cobham and Emily Jane (Johnston) Cobham (Lot 28) – presumed adopted. 1901 N.B. census, Kent County, shows Emma as their daughter. William and Emma had only one child – Atkin C. Teed. Emma died sometime between 1906 and 1929 prior to the death of her son, Atkin. She is believed to have also died of consumption. We do not have any record of her death date or where she is buried. - (see information Lot 43 where Atkin is buried).

Elisha and Cassie had twelve children (10 listed below, and 2 above):

Ellsworth – born October 6, 1895, died December 18, 1974 – he married Elizabeth Alice (Bessie) Johnston on October 1, 1926 at Moncton. Bessie was born February 5, 1901 in Boston, and died January 17, 1971 – she was the daughter of Robert and Mary Johnston (see page 22). They are buried at Fair Haven Memorial Gardens. Ellsworth came home from Detroit for his father's funeral and did not return.

Dorothy Johnston has a photograph of Ellsworth and Norval Johnston dressed in military uniforms and looking very young, so I believe it is safe to say that Ellsworth served in the First World War.

You will note on page 8 that John Colborne was one of the Trustees of the Notre Dame Union Church at the time that title to the Notre Dame Union Church and Cemetery was transferred from Bowen and Harriet Smith.

William J. Colborne was generally called "Billy Colborne". Mora Lee (Wood) was his wife - she died February 18, 1917 of bronchitis at 42 years of age. Billy owned a sawmill on the Falconer Road between Notre Dame and MacDougall Settlement.

There appears to be some question as to the proper death date for Billy Colborne. It is possible that the exact date of death is April 28, 1927, and date of burial May 1, 1927. This information was found in the diary records of Mrs. Clara Taylor - this certainly does not constitute any proof, but it does raise questions. The Union Church Records indicate that Billy Colborne paid his annual pew rent in 1926, and the following year it was not paid. This could be another verification of the early 1927 date of death.

Sarah Colborne was Billy's mother – she lived with the family.

Glenna died August 7, 1990. Glenna and Gordon lived on the old Murray Homestead on the Murray Road, Kent County. They are buried in Elmwood Cemetery, Moncton. See

information under Lot 55 for their family tree.

LORNE

- was born in 1910 and died at the age of 11 - he is buried in this plot with his parents and grandmother.

JOHN W. WOOD

A list of burials prepared in 1914 shows "John Wood, child" buried here. We do not have the child's name or age. Once again the likelihood is that John Wood acquired this lot for the purpose of burying an infant or young child. Another cemetery record indicates that two people were buried in this plot – that presents a mystery, unless the Wood family lost two small children.

John W. Wood married Emaline (Leaman), and in later years they lived with a child of theirs on Salem Road, Hillsborough. We do not know for certain where they are buried, but it is likely that John is buried in a family plot in Hillsborough. The family believes that Emaline ultimately lived with her daughter in New Mills, Restigouche County, New Brunswick in her last years and is probably buried in that community. We located a Death Certificate for an Emaline Wood who died January 3, 1945 in Restigouche County.

Mora Lee (Wood) Colburne (Lot 18) was one of John and Emaline's children.

The tombstone on this plot shows that the above persons were the children of John and Bertha Horsman.

Alsie was born May 28, 1901 and died May 29, 1901. Anna Jane was born May 28, 1901 and died September 22, 1901. Leslie James was born June 3, 1904 and died February 22, 1910.

Bertha (Johnston) Horsman – mother of the above children - was the daughter of James Johnston and Ann (Chisholm) Johnston, who are buried in this Cemetery (Lot 8).

These children's names appear on the Memorial Stone erected in this Cemetery in October 2003 because their original tombstone on the plot is becoming difficult to read.

ROBERT A. ROBINSON (1855-1924) ROBINA A. JOHNSTON (1857-1891) ANNIE B. WILMARTH (1880-1910)

Robina Ann (Johnston) Robinson was born December 16, 1857 to James Johnston and Ann (Chisholm) Johnston (Lot 8). She married Robert Ansley Robinson July 17, 1879. Kent County Death Records indicate that she died November 16, 1891 at age 34 of consumption, and that she was a resident of Notre Dame and died at Notre Dame. It is believed that Robert Ansley Robinson (who was born at McAdam, New Brunswick) moved to the United States sometime after Robina's death, and that following his death on May 2, 1924 that he was returned to Notre Dame for burial with his wife and daughter.

Robert Ansley and Robina Ann had five children (as follows):

Annie Blair – born June 10, 1880 and died September 26, 1910. She married Henry A. Wilmarth in 1908. They lived in Springfield, Massachusetts, and had one daughter who was born in 1909. She was returned to Notre Dame and buried in this lot with her mother.

George - lived in Melrose, Massachusetts.

<u>Frank</u> - lived in Gloucester, Massachusetts.

James - lived in McAdam, New Brunswick.

Robert - lived in River Hebert, Nova Scotia.

See information Lot 8 - Robina's parents, James Johnston and Ann (Chisholm) Johnston.

See information Lot 28 – Robina's sister, Emily Jane Cobham.

See information Lot 37 - Robina's brother, James McKie Johnston.

See information Lot 27 - Hattie Smith whose tombstone appears on this lot.

Hattie Smith's tombstone appears on this lot, whereas the plan indicates she is buried in Lot 27. Hattie Smith was the daughter of Harrison and Annie Smith, and died March 11, 1901 at 2 years of age. The only connection that seems possible is that Harrison Smith (Hattie's father) and Mary Katherine (Johnton) Smith's husband, Fred Smith were brothers (both sons of Bowen and Harriet Smith (see Lot 2). Since Robina (Johnston) Robinson and Mary Katherine (Johnston) Smith (Lot 8) were sisters there is some connection of sorts to little Hattie, who may have been actually buried in this plot.

HATTIE SMITH (1899 – 1901)

Hattie Smith was the daughter of Harrison and Annie Smith. She died March 11, 1901 at two years of age.

The Cemetery Plan shows Hattie Smith to be buried here, but her small tombstone was placed on Lot 21 - the plot where Robert Ansley Robinson and Robina A. (Johnston) Robinson are buried.

The only connection that seems possible is that Harrison Smith (Hattie's father) and Mary <u>Katherine</u> (Johnton) Smith's husband, Fred Smith were brothers (both may have been sons of Bowen and Harriet Smith (see Lot 2). Since Robina (Johnston) Robinson and Mary <u>Katherine</u> (Johnston) Smith (Lot 8) were sisters there is some connection of sorts to little Hattie, who may have been actually buried in Lot 21.

WILLIAM JAMES COBHAM (1855-1939) EMILY JANE COBHAM (1855-1931)

William <u>James</u> Cobham was born October 20, 1855 in Parish Roscarberry, County Cork, Ireland, and died September 24, 1939 in Moncton, New Brunswick. He was buried September 26, 1939 at Notre Dame, New Brunswick. William <u>James</u> Cobham immigrated from Ireland in 1865 to Saint John, New Brunswick. His parents were: James Cobham (1809, Ireland – June 28, 1877, Saint John, N.B.) and Lura Smith (1813 England – March 19, 1893, Saint John, N.B.) James Cobham Sr. was in the Coast Guard and signed on in 1831 in Sligo, Ireland.

Emily Jane (Johnston) Cobham was the daughter of James Johnston and Ann (Chisholm) Johnston (Lot 8). She was born September 29, 1855 at Notre Dame, New Brunswick, died July 14, 1931 at Notre Dame, New Brunswick, and was buried July 15, 1931 at Notre Dame, New Brunswick.

William James Cobham and Emily Jane (also recorded as Emma) Johnston were married October 28, 1879, at Carleton, Saint John, New Brunswick. Mr. Cobham is believed to have been a sea captain who worked away from home a great deal. It is believed that he owned his own vessel, and my source says it was sometimes moored at a dock on the Petitcodiac River (near Reid Company in Moncton). Mrs. Cobham operated a hotel in Notre Dame, which was the Cobham's home. It is said that the hotel had about a dozen rooms. This building burned about 1945.

It is believed that they had no children of their own, however, they did raise and adopt many children. 1901 N.B. Census Records show the following children:

Cobham, G. Cliford, son, born June 13, 1880 - age 20.

Cobham, Emma B., daughter, born March 17, 1889 - age 12.

Other children not shown on Census were:

Cobham, Edna Florence, born August 21, 1905 – (James Cobham's grandniece – adopted. She married John Joseph Tidd of Notre Dame, N.B.)

Cobham, Iva - married Arthur Kennedy of Rothesay, N.B.

Cobham, Roy - no known records.

Records indicate that Emma B. Cobham was their adopted daughter (1901 N.B. Census – Kent County records show Emma as the daughter of Mr. & Mrs. Cobham – presumed to be adopted). Emma married William J. Teed October 15, 1906 (William buried Lot 15). The Marriage Record for William and Emma indicates that James Cobham was the witness. It also indicates that Emma was born March 17, 1889 in Saint John, New Brunswick to George and Annie (last name not legible). William and Emma had one child – Atkin C. Teed who was born in 1907. William J. Teed died March 22, 1908 at Notre Dame of consumption – he was only 22 years of age. The family believes that Emma died prior to Atkin's death. It appears that after his father's death Atkin remained with the Teed family in Notre Dame, and he also died of tuberculosis at the age of 22. See information Lots 15 and 43.

HAROLD WILLIAM JOHNSTON (1909-1963) DOROTHY OPAL (TAYLOR) JOHNSTON (1915-λοοδ)

Harold Johnston was born September 8, 1909, and died September 23, 1963. He was the son of Arthur P. Johnston and Mirinda J. (Biggs) Johnston (buried Lot 47), and grandson of William Johnston and Margaret Jane (Dysart) Johnston (buried Lot 34).

Harold worked as a labourer, often as a "truck driver" (which was something he loved to do), and finally at one point in his life achieved the goal of owning his own truck. He was one of the community youngsters who was needed at home after only six years of schooling. He kept his books regularly tracking truck expenses, etc. and was of course fluently bilingual. He was a strong, handsome, fun-loving and hard-working man, but had a very gentle and kind nature even in the most stressful of situations (like the day when his young son was under the truck helping to do something when he realized that the jack was going to let go, but instead of panicking and screaming he calmly and quickly got Sandy out without alarming him in any way).

All his children were often afforded the wonderful opportunity to sit on his knee and "drive" his truck - at least that is what we thought we were doing. None of us can ever remember him raising his voice to us and definitely we were never punished. Because he had a truck and he was well known and trusted by everyone in the community he would often be called upon in the middle of the night to pull someone out of the ditch or out of a snowbank, or whatever the problem may have been. I remember him coming to the window in our bedroom (which was at the front of the house), raising the window and calling "Hello" to whoever was there, and then saying (often in French) "Yes, okay, I'll be right down".

On November 15, 1939 he married Dorothy Opal Taylor (born August 18, 1915), daughter of Calvin and Clara Taylor, Notre Dame. They lived in Notre Dame over the years, and Harold died there September 23, 1963. They had three children:

<u>Linda Dawn</u> born July 2, 1940, married Victor Joseph Bray (born January 2, 1940) on September 10, 1960 in the Notre Dame Union Church. They lived in Fredericton, Edmundston, Amherst, Kentville, and presently live in Bedford, N.S. They have three sons:

(<u>Jeffrey Douglas</u> born November 2, 1962 - married to Deborah Louise Carr (born February 22, 1959) from Moncton, N.B. on September 18, 2004. They live in Dartmouth, N.S.)

(Stephen Harold born March 7, 1966 lives in Halifax with his partner, Margaret Kelly Fogarty, born April 22, 1970, from Dominion, Cape Breton. Their marriage will take place in Halifax October 8, 2005.)

(<u>Christopher Shawn</u> born July 12, 1967 married Shiralee June Carr (born June 24, 1967) of Fall River, N.S., on September 4, 1993, and they live in Fall River. They have two children: Mirinda Sidney born December 21, 1996 and Freeman Davis born October 31, 2000.)

Judy Fay born April 18, 1942, married Guy Joseph Allain (born June 12, 1940) on September 1, 1962 at the Notre Dame Catholic Church. Judy died January 22, 1994, and is buried in the Notre Dame Catholic Church Cemetery. They lived in Notre Dame, and Guy continues to live there. They have three children: (Deborah Lee born March 14, 1963 lives in Fredericton, N.B. She has a son-Wesley Patrick Lafleur who was born October 5, 1994.) (Karalee Tricia born January 31, 1975 - she lives in Notre Dame.) (Todd Harold born December 14, 1967 is divorced and lives in Notre Dame. He has two children: Jennifer Sarah JJ, born April 23, 1993, and James Harold GG, born August 12, 1995.)

Sandy Harold William born March 11, 1950, married Cecile Marie Stella Maillet (born April 8, 1948) from Cocagne, N.B. on August 18, 1972, and they have resided in Notre Dame since then. They have three children: (Harold William born June 22, 1973 lives in Dieppe with his partner, Shelley Barieau from Dalhousie, N.B.)
(Katherine Nicole born December 31, 1976 lives in Moncton.)
(Jason Terrance born June 28, 1982 lives in Notre Dame.)

Dorothy is presently living at People's Park Tower in Moncton. As was written elsewhere Dorothy played the church organ for a number of years, taught Sunday School, and acted as the Union Church Secretary-Treasurer from 1950 to 1965 when the church ceased to have regular Sunday services. She was also involved with the Notre Dame Union Church Cemetery Committee that was established in 1977. Her involvements in the community over the years were numerous. In addition she belonged to the Sons of Temperance Lodge in Moncton, and is a Past Worthy Matron of the Frank H. Tingley Chapter No. 5 of the Order of the Eastern Star.

She is a very talented lady, and has long been sewing, knitting and crocheting. She always was an avid photographer, and still is. This talent was often one that annoyed her children, however, she does have many photographs of us (which we now appreciate), of the many trips she has taken, and also has many wonderful photographs of people and buildings in Notre Dame (a few of these are shown at the front of this book).

She hosted many parties in our home when we were young. Some were as simple as people just getting together for a "sing-song" or "hymn-sing" with Mum at the piano, while others were special anniversaries or maybe a Ladies Aid Meeting. In later years the children and grandchildren were shown the art of making ice cream the old fashioned way, and everybody got to turn the "crank".

RALPH E. CRAWFORD (1925-1929)

Ralph was born February 27, 1925, and died June 27, 1929. He was only four years of age when he died as a result of being struck by a car.

Ralph was the son of Everett and Margaret (Johnston) Crawford, who are buried in Elmwood Cemetery. Everett Hale Crawford was born May 23, 1903 and died April 5, 1977. Margaret Dysart (Johnston) Crawford was born July 8, 1904, and died September 25, 1999.

Ralph's maternal grandparents were Arthur P. and Mirinda J. (Biggs), buried Lot 47; great-grandparents were William and Margaret Jane (Dysart) Johnston, buried Lot 34. Other family members are buried in Lots 32, 34 and 35.

Ralph's paternal grandparents were Elisha A. and Catherine J. (Dysart) Crawford, buried Lot 16; great-parents were William H. and Mary Abegail (Marr) Crawford, buried Lot 46. Other family members are buried in Lots 13, 18 and 48.

William Johnston's parents were Andrew Johnston, who was born in Scotland January 12, 1803 and Anne Spence, who was born in Northern Ireland in September 1802. They were married in Cocagne, New Brunswick December 5, 1827. About 1831 Andrew Johnston received a land grant in Notre Dame and became the third resident of the community. He farmed this property, followed by his son, William, and later by his grandson, Arthur. Andrew and Anne's burial place is unknown (obituary says "buried at Cocagne River, N.B.") - this could cover a large territory, and it is always possible that they were buried on the family farm. They had ten children born in the Parish of Dundas: Robert - born 1826.

William - born September 28, 1828.

Robina Anne - born 1829, died March 15, 1917. (Death records indicate she died March 6, 1917.) She is believed to be buried in Lot 35 this Cemetery.

<u>James</u> - born August 9, 1831 and died October 19, 1913. He married Ann Chisholm November 28, 1854. They are buried in Lot 8 this Cemetery.

John Andrew - born January 28, 1841, and died April 2, 1925. He married Hannah Jane Torrans, who was born February 27, 1845 and died February 27, 1922. John Andrew moved to the United States in 1862, and was married June 18, 1865. Most of their married life was spent in Baltimore, Maryland, where John Andrew was the Bridgekeeper for the trolley car bridge across the north branch of the Patapsco River. He was responsible for opening the bridge for boat traffic heading in and out of Baltimore, a job done by hand turning a wheel in the "engine room". When open, the draw was parallel with the shore.

<u>David</u> - born 1842, died February 11, 1930. He married Susan Graves. <u>Amelia</u> - born 1845 and died June 1913. She is believed to be buried in Lot 35 this Cemetery.

Robert Blythe Murray was one of the Trustees of the Notre Dame Union Church shown on the deed of Cemetery Property in 1894. It appears that he left Notre Dame about 1919.

Robert and Mary had a son - Clifford - who was born August 21, 1881. Clifford married Mildred (Millie) Coates. Clifford died August 1952 while on a visit to Denver, Colorado - his body was flown home to Moncton for burial.

The N.B. Archives Death Records (1888-1920) records the following:

"McCarthy, Stephen, aged 72, residence: Notre Dame, born Moncton, died at Notre Dame 1916.03.13."

This gentleman was a labourer, and his religious affiliation was Methodist.

Church records indicate that Lot 38 was purchased by Charles McCharty March 14, 1916.

Margaret May Tidd, daughter of James William Tidd and Adelaide Gamble (Ern Tidd's grandparents), married Albert Webb. Mary Webb appears to be his sister (1891 Kent County Parish of Dundas census shows Mary and Albert with the same parents). Mary was born at Little River, Cumberland County, to parents Leander J. Webb and Celia Ann Brundage.

Records of persons who purchased cemetery lots shows Lot 39 purchased by Leander J. Webb June 30, 1915.

Another cemetery record shows "list of burials in Union Church Cemetery" - Mrs. Samuel Webb who died February 6, 1914, was buried February 7, 1914 at age 81 years, Pastor Rev. Mr. Byron.

Presumably Leander, Celia and Mrs. Samuel Webb are all buried here with Mary.

Leander and Celia were married in Westchester, Cumberland County, N.S. 1864.

JOHN K. CHAPMAN (1831-1896) HIS WIFE, ELIZABETH (1831-1909) THEIR DAUGHTER, ANNIE (1870-1918)

These names were shown on the new Memorial Stone erected October 2003 because the print on this stone is difficult to read.

John Keillor and Elizabeth (Coveny) Chapman were originally buried in the Methodist Church Cemetery at Ward's Corner, New Brunswick, however, their son (John A. Chapman) moved their remains to this cemetery after the Ward's Corner church burned. This would have occurred sometime prior to 1911.

At that same time John A. moved his grandparents' remains [Edwin Chapman and Ann (Ogden) Chapman] to the Baptist Church Cemetery in McKee's Mills.

John K. and Elizabeth's children were:

Annie (1870-1918) - buried in this plot. She was born in Cocagne, and lived in Moncton. She died August 4, 1918.

John Alexander (1873-1911) - married Lenora Ethel Biggs September 3, 1902. Lenora was a sister to Mirinda (Biggs) Johnston (see page 70- Lot 47-Arthur Johnston). John A. worked in the General Store in Notre Dame for a time, and later worked at the CNR General Offices in Moncton. Their children were:

George Percival (1903-1984) married Gladys Maude (Smith). They have a daughter, *Joan Marie Johnson*, who lives in Brentwood Bay outside Victoria, B.C.

Kenneth Keillor (1906-1925)

Hilda Mae (1908-1976)

The Union Church pew rent records indicate that John A. Chapman had left Notre Dame by 1907.

The Chapman's are descended from William Chapman who came to Point du Bute, New Brunswick from Yorkshire in 1774.

Samuel Wesley was the son of Thomas and Alice (Donnelly) Teed (buried in Lot 15). Annie's parents were Edward Stuart and Katherine (Kate) (McNeil) Stuart, who lived in Scotch Settlement, and are both buried there.

Samuel was born April 24, 1888, and Annie was born in 1892. They were married in Moncton October 27, 1920. Samuel and Annie moved to Notre Dame, and lived on the Teed Road near the family homestead until 1934 when they moved to the old Stuart homestead in Scotch Settlement.

Samuel and Annie had three children:

Ellsworth (died at 2 weeks of age)
Alice Katherine, who died at the age of 4 (1924-1928)
Muriel (Crandall).

Muriel Crandall (born April 25, 1922), married Bart Crandall August 16, 1941. Bart was born January 27, 1918, and died July 19, 2003. There is something about Muriel and Bart that their children will always remember about their parents, which is that they had the best marriage anyone could imagine - and were wonderful role models in the way they were always available to their children and their friends. They made their home in Moncton, and had the following three children:

Robert Barton - born May 12, 1942 and died May 16, 1984. He was married to Jeannette LeBlanc, whose birthday is June 23rd. Jeannette was born in Holland (her father married her mother during the war - they remained in Holland for a short time, then moved to Canada). Since Robert's death Jeannette married Ken Drew, and they live in Woodstock, New Brunswick.

Bob and Jeannette lived on the Cove Road in Scotch Settlement (on the old property that Robert's grandparents had originally owned). They turned the property into a "hobby farm", and to the delight of their children they had all manner of animals including lambs, goats, ponies, horses, etc., as well as a pond where Canada geese came year after year. Bob was a member of the Moncton Police Force for 11 years where he worked as the "Dog Master". In those 11 years he worked continuously with a dog named "PAX". Following that he worked for Midland Transport as a Safety Control Manager. He was away from home a good deal, and Jeannette spent a lot of time taking care of their many animals.

Robert and Jeannette are remembered by their children as being wonderful and "fun" parents. Their children are:

<u>Barton Robert</u> - was born March 15, 1965, and lives in Moncton. His occupation as a long-haul truck driver means he is away from home a good deal of the time, mostly in the United States.

Renatta Marie - who was born March 26, 1969. Renatta married Carl Douglas McLong (born October 22, 1966) on July 21, 1990. They are now divorced. They have three children: Tereska Alecia Marie, born May 6, 1991; Carleigh Johanna, born March 23, 1994; and Shanyssa Taylor, born September 12, 1996.

Myrna Skaling - born July 10, 1944. She married George Frederick Skaling on March 21, 1964, and they live in Nanaimo, British Columbia. They have three children:

Randy Frederick - born November 28, 1964, died November 18, 1982; Kellie Ann - born May 25, 1969, married Jason Gill on June 9, 1990. They have three children: Mariah Anne born June 26, 1992, Anyssa Suzanne born February 24, 1994, and Randall Jason Jeffrey born April 20, 1995. They all live in Kamloops, B.C.

Kimberly Jane - born July 31, 1970, who married Michael Loyd on May 18, 1991. They have two children: *Jacob Clayton* born January 28, 1994, and *Hannah Marie Ruth* born February 13, 2000. They live in Modesto, California.

Suzanne Melanson - born December 21, 1954, married Lawrence Melanson (born January 20, 1957) on December 1, 2001. They live in Moncton, N.B.

Atkin C. Teed was born May 14, 1907 at Notre Dame, N.B., and died September 12, 1929 at Notre Dame, N.B. He was buried September 14, 1929, Notre Dame, N.B. Atkin had lived with his parents in the Teed Homestead and remained there after his father's death. His mother also died sometime between 1907 and 1929, although we have no records of the date of death or place of burial. He continued to live there (with Alice, Edna, George, Jack and Arthur) until the latter part of his illness, when he went to live next-door with his Uncle Samuel and Aunt Annie. Atkin died of tuberculosis at the age of 22 - of the same illness and at the same age as his father.

Muriel Crandall especially remembers Cassie Crawford who was the family's good neighbour and close friend during the time they lived in Notre Dame. After they moved to Scotch Settlement they continued a close relationship with the Crawford family.

ERNEST TIDD (1890-1918) MARGARET (GAMBLE) MULLIN) (1861-1940)

This lot was recorded in church records as purchased by James Tidd in 1918. James' son, Ernest, is buried in this lot. Ernest was born June 30, 1890 at Notre Dame, N.B. He married Iva Belle Watters on November 17, 1915 at Westmorland County, N.B., and they had one son - Lloyd Tidd. They lived in Somerville, Massachusetts, U.S.A. where Ernest was employed as a train brakeman. While at work Ernest was accidentally killed by a train September 19, 1918 at Waterton, Middlesex, Massachusetts, U.S.A. He was returned to Notre Dame for burial.
